

Roll a Story Imagination



Materials:

- Coloring Pencils
- Story Telling Cubes | Xavier Riddle
- DIY Story Telling Cube Template
- Scissors
- Tape

In this activity, your child can use their own creativity and imagination to practice storytelling by rolling homemade dice to tell a unique story!

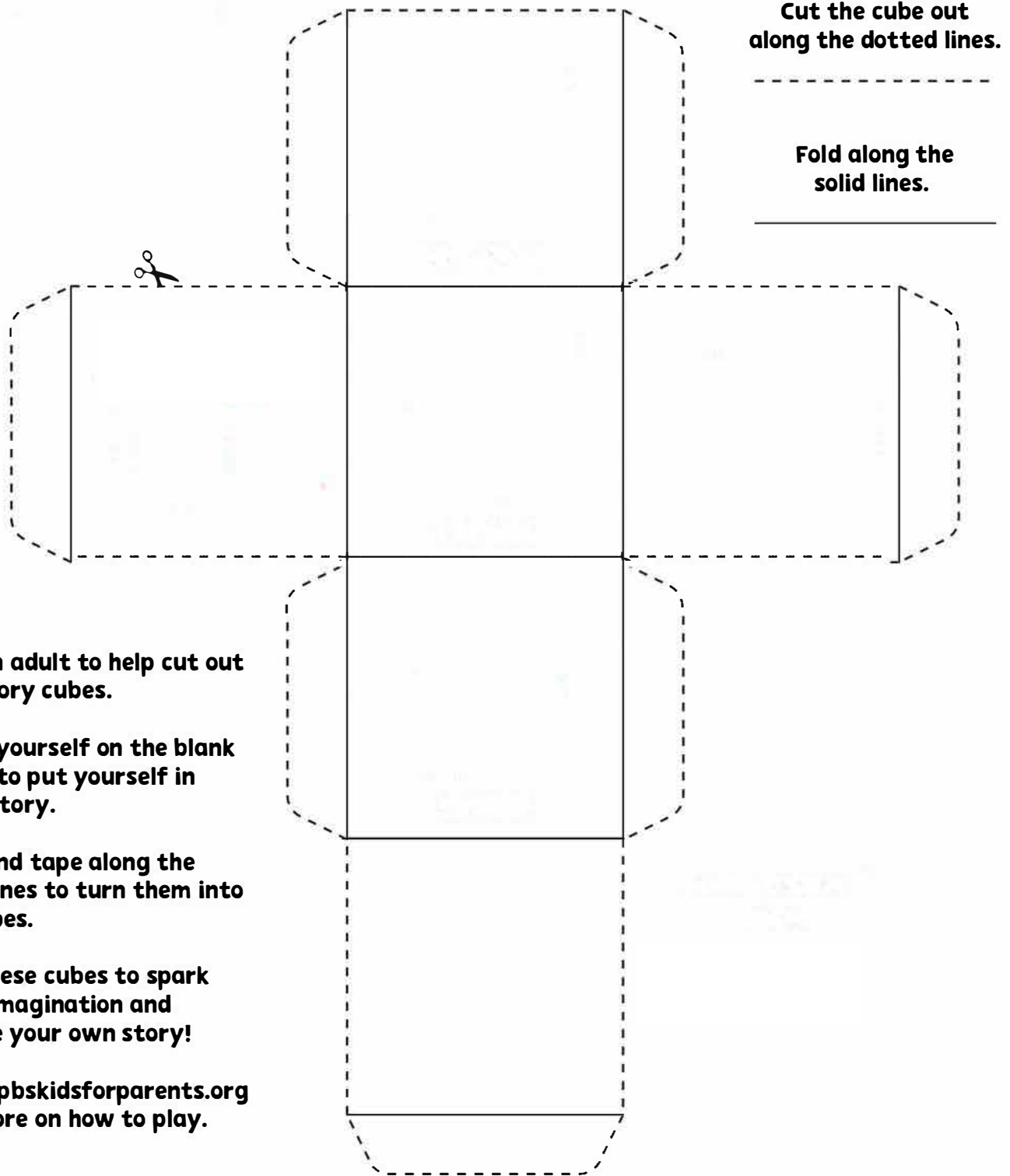
Instructions:

1. Have your child draw their imagination scenarios on the DIY Story Telling Cube Template
2. Cut the printables along the dotted lines, and make sure a parent helps with any cutting! Optional: To make the dice sturdier, paste the printable onto cardboard or an empty cereal box before cutting.
3. Fold the three printables into cube shapes, following along the solid lines.
4. Secure the edges with tape to hold them into their cube shapes.
5. Now it's time to start the story! Have your child roll the character cube. Whoever the cube lands on will be the main character in your child's story. Repeat with the other two cubes to find out the setting and the object for your story.
6. Once you have your three story elements, get creative and tell a story! Combine what you have rolled into your own creation. Will Yadina get stuck in the butterfly observatory carrying boxes of pizza and have to find her way back home? Or will Berby encounter lost kittens in the Secret Museum? The possibilities are endless!

Try more fun ways to play!

1. Assign each cube to a family member. Using the 3 story elements that have been rolled, have each person describe their part of the story: What will the character be doing in this story? Why are they at the ___? What happened to the object?
OR
2. Roll each cube multiple times to tell a more elaborate story with additional characters, settings, or objects.
3. Once everyone has described their part of the story, work together to continue the story by taking turns and adding what they think happens next.
Keep the story going as long as you can!

DIY Story Cube

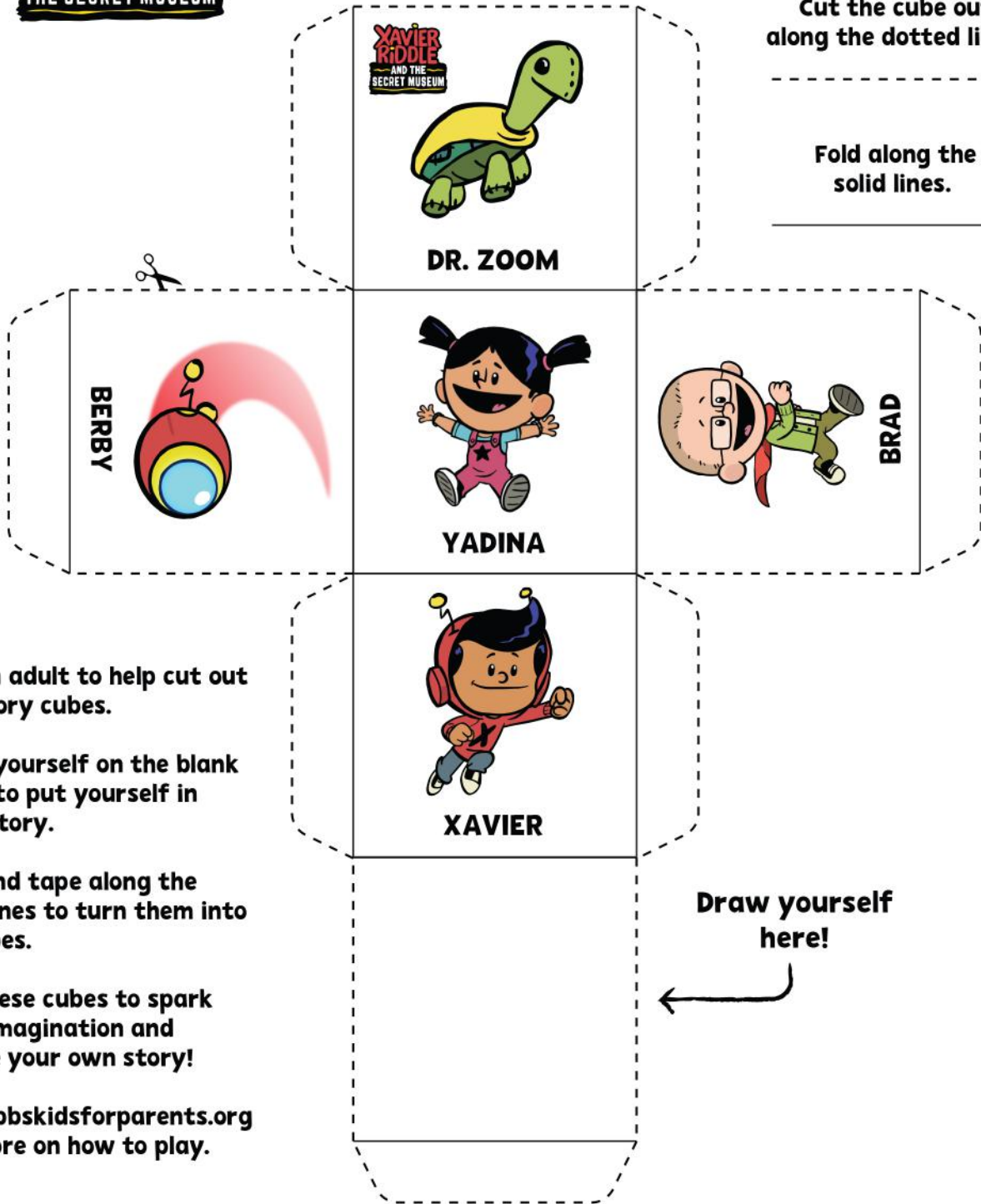




Story Cubes

2. Draw yourself on the blank panel to put yourself in your story.
3. Fold and tape along the solid lines to turn them into 3D cubes.
4. Use these cubes to spark your imagination and create your own story!

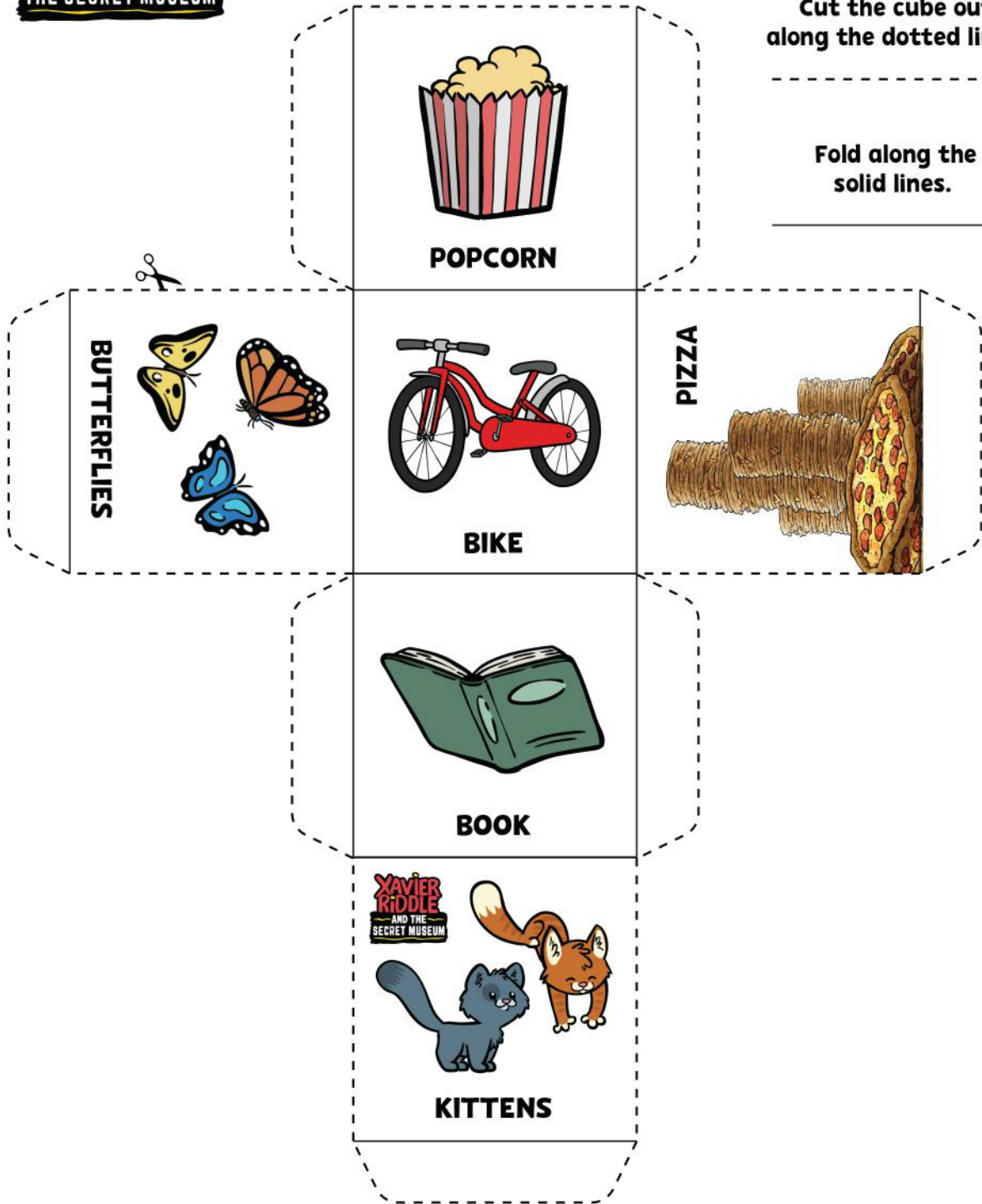

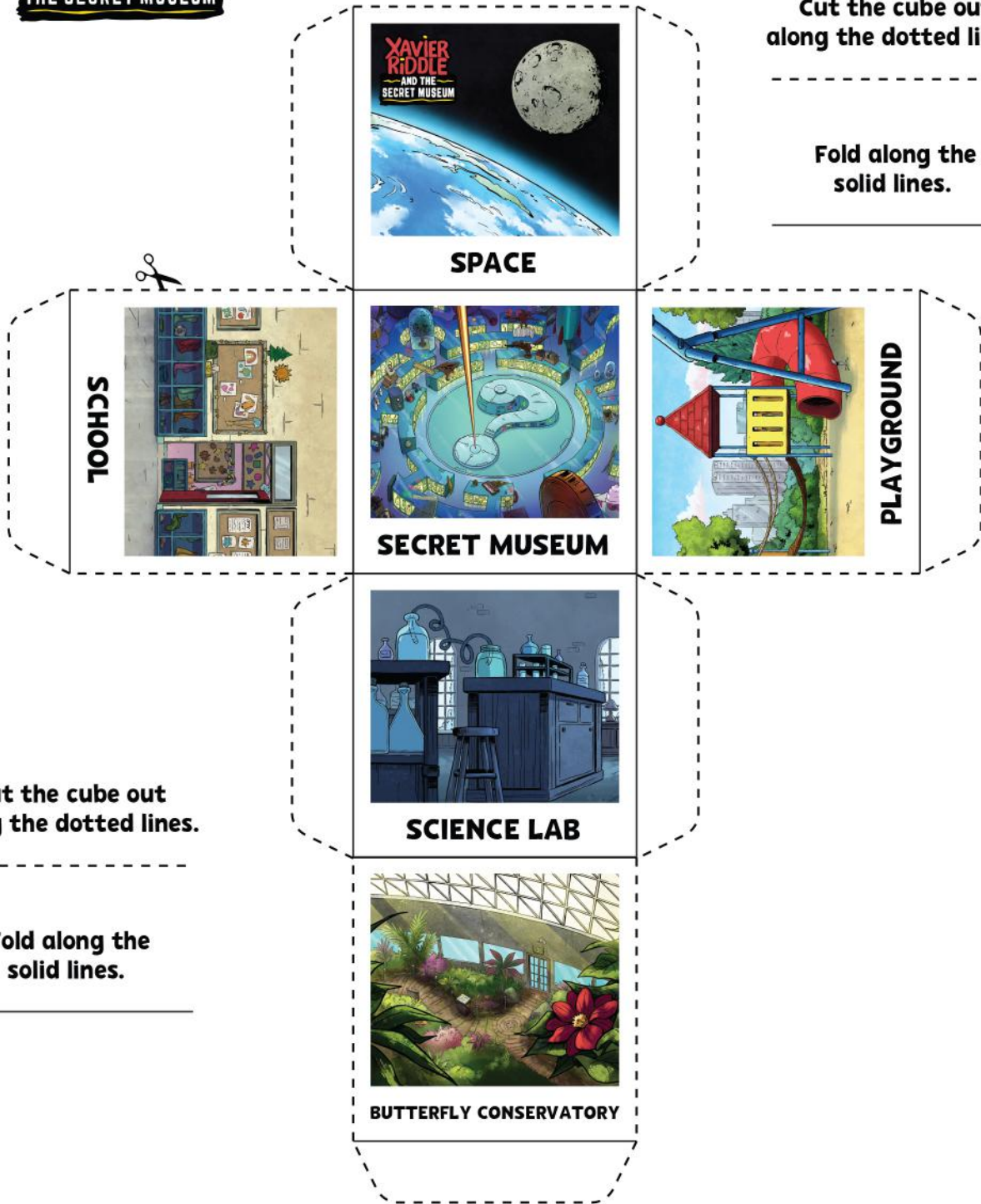
